was a little nervous having my South Beach penthouse painted orange," says the owner of this 36th-floor condominium in The Setai. But designer Martin C. Martinez quickly waylaid his fears with a series of sketches illustrating the use of this hue to instill the home with South Beach spice.

"Martin was so passionate about how the apartment would look," the owner says. "So I trusted him and his creative eye," The owner's only directive — to keep the same architectural and design flavor of the building, which "blends an elegant Asian tradition throughout." Martinez says.




Thus, the interior seamlessly melds the Oriental motifs of The Setai with the sizzle of South Beach.


Ivory, dark brown and natural woods complement the scheme, creating a Zen-like ambiance from room to room, such as the hallway from the main living areas to the bedrooms. "It was a long, uninteresting hallway with a floor begging for drama," Martinez says. The answer — paint the wall orange, the ceiling ivory and cover the floor in sandblasted-black granite with a teak inlay. Then, add striking black-and-white photographs to create "an art-gallery effect," he continues.

The main living areas function as one large space with an uncut limestone wall on one side and floor-to-ceiling windows on the other. Warm and inviting, the living area features an ivory suede sofa and leather armchairs energized with apricot accent pillows. An antique teak console and accessories carry out the Far Eastern aesthetic.

Orange, in its fruit form, appropriately makes an appearance as the dining area's centerpiece. A mosaic of teak wood forms the table, while leather-wrapped teak chairs provide seating.



A quiet corner of the master bedroom includes a work area.





At the far end of the living area, a wall floats between the main living areas and the den on the other side. On each side, a flat-screen TV hangs on the wall. In the den, a wicker cocktail table and black-wicker chair enhance the interior's earthy sensibility.

A reversal of color takes place in the master bedroom, where orange dresses the ceiling and ivory coats the walls. As in the rest of the home, silk accent pillows add dollops of color. "I'm constant with materials I use," Martinez says. "Silk is my fabric of choice on the bed and elsewhere in the apartment." Round and sunburst mirrors in the bedroom and master bath add Zen-like warmth.

Instead of a headboard in the guestroom, Martinez chose a long rolled pillow with an assembly of accent pillows, "Whenever it's possible, I don't use headboards," he says.

"What makes this home so special is its Miami Beach location, the building's name, and the powerful statement of this finished apartment," Martinez says.
